# CONSENT FORM Seacroft Stories: Maps and Plans

#### **Project Outline:**

This project will collect people's memories of Seacroft for a new archive collection which will be deposited at the West Yorkshire Archive Service. The archives currently do not hold much material relating to the modern history of Seacroft, and we want to address that gap by collecting personal accounts of life in Seacroft from past and present residents.

The project is a collaboration between the researcher (Jessica Hammett), 'A Quiet Word' artists (Alison Andrews and Matthew Bellwood), Chapel FM and the West Yorkshire Archive Service. We are collecting written, artistic and spoken stories. We will be organising activities and events throughout the project which you can participate in. Activities will be explained to you before you take part so that you can decide whether or not you would like to participate.

#### Do I have to take part?

No, participation is voluntary.

#### Can I withdraw at any time?

Yes, you can withdraw at any time without giving a reason by contacting the researcher, Jessica Hammett, using the contact details above. However, if you wish to withdraw at a later date, please note that if you request anonymisation, once the data has been anonymised your data cannot be withdrawn from the archive. Data will be anonymised on 1 January 2022. If your data appears in published work this cannot be withdrawn.

#### What do I have to do?

During this activity you will be invited to add your stories and memories to maps, plans and worksheets. You can do the activity wherever you like. You can do it on your own or you can talk to other people about it.

## How will the findings be used?

There will be a number of project outputs in which your stories and experiences may be used:

- In published academic work written by the researcher Jessica Hammett, available in print and online
- As part of end of project public outputs which will be shown in Seacroft
- On the project website which anyone with a computer can access
- Permanently available in archives: at the West Yorkshire Archive Service for anyone who visits the archives to view; and on the UK Data Service website which anyone with a computer can access
- Chapel FM, 'A Quiet Word' artists and the West Yorkshire Archive Service may also use contributions in future projects

## Will my taking part in the study be kept confidential?

You can decide whether to anonymise your stories and contributions. If you wish to do this, please be aware that you may still be identifiable to others even when all personal information is removed.

#### What are the possible disadvantages and risks of taking part?

Anonymity cannot be guaranteed. Because the project is based in Seacroft, people who know you may be able to identify your stories and contributions even if a pseudonym is used and all personal information is removed. The memories and experiences you discuss may be upsetting.

## What will happen to the data collected?

The data will be available to all and free to access on the project website, at the West Yorkshire Archive Service, and on the UK Data Service website.
